

PRIVACY POLICY

This information (or "privacy policy") is provided in compliance with current legislation on the protection of personal data and, in particular, pursuant to EU Regulation 2016/679 relating to the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data , as well as the free movement of such data (so-called "GDPR") with reference to the processing of personal data of users who access the site and register for the Zotac CUP tournament.

This Privacy Policy, therefore, concerns only this site and is not provided for other websites that may be consulted by the user via links, even if published on the site.

The site is set up to allow participation in the Zotac CUP: users who wish to participate will therefore have to register on the site, setting their user name and password for subsequent logins to their personal page on the site.

1. Data controller

ZOTAC Technology Limited 18-24 Shan Mei Street, Fo Tan, Shatin, N.T., Hong Kong is the Data Controller of your personal data.

2. Purpose of the processing, legal basis

By accessing and consulting this site, information relating to users as identified or identifiable natural persons can be collected and processed. If personal data is acquired in this way, the same, in compliance with current legislation on the protection of personal data, will be processed solely to pursue the following purposes:

3. Methods of data processing

Personal data is processed lawfully and fairly and used only for the purposes indicated in art. 2. The processing will take place using tools suitable for guaranteeing the security and confidentiality of personal data and with automated tools suitable for storing, managing and transmitting the data. Specific security measures are adopted to prevent data loss and limit the risks of illicit or incorrect use and unauthorized access.

Personal data will be kept for the times prescribed by law and, in any case, for the time strictly necessary to follow up on the activities for which they were collected (for the period envisaged for carrying out the Competition, for the assignment of the prizes to the winners and for the final activities of the Competition, as required by current legislation) and/or until the consent is revoked, if applicable. Personal data processed for marketing purposes will in any case be kept for a maximum of twenty-four months and those processed for profiling purposes for a maximum of twelve months (subject to any amendments and/or additions to the reference legislation on the protection of personal data which will be expressly communicated).

4. Who can the collected data be communicated to?

The treatments connected to the web services of this site and to the management of the Competition are only handled by specialized and competent technical personnel, expressly authorized for treatment by the Data Controller. In particular, the data may be communicated to third parties whose collaboration Zotac may and/or shall use for the performance of the services offered and for the execution of the Competition. The acquired data may be communicated to the technological partners and consultants used by the Data Controller for the provision of the services requested by the users, always in compliance with the purposes indicated in the art. 2. To this end, the subjects who will have access to personal data will be specifically authorized for processing by the Data Controller and, if due, appointed as Data Processors, pursuant to articles 28 and 29 of the GDPR. The data collected for the purposes set out above may also be communicated to associated companies or companies belonging to the same corporate group as the Data Controller and to subjects authorized for this purpose by provisions of law and European legislation.

5. What are the rights of the interested parties?

The interested party is the natural person, identified or identifiable, to whom the personal data being processed refer.

Your request will be processed as soon as possible or in any case within thirty working days of its receipt.

- You can request access to your data, to find out which data and why they are processed by the Data Controller;
- You can request the rectification, cancellation or limitation of the processing of personal data concerning you;
- You can object to the processing of personal data, even if this occurs for profiling or direct marketing purposes;
- You can request the portability of your data in readable format, structured and commonly used;
- You can revoke the consent to the previously given treatment (if the treatment has required your consent);

Cookie Policy

What are? Cookies are information stored by the browser when a website is visited with any suitable device (such as a PC, tablet or smartphone). Each cookie contains various data (e.g. the name of the server it comes from, a numeric identifier, etc.), can remain in the system for the duration of a session (until the browser is closed) or for long periods and can contain a unique identification code.

What are they for? Cookies are used for various purposes depending on their type: some are strictly necessary for the correct functionality of a website (technical cookies), while others optimize its performance to offer a better user experience or allow acquiring statistics on the use of the site, such as analytics cookies or allow you to view personalized advertising, such as profiling cookies.

Consent: any provision of the user's consent is memorized by the Data Controllers as far as they are concerned, by means of a technical cookie, with a duration of 12 months. The user is informed both through the brief information (banner displayed until consent is given or denied, as explained in the paragraph "How to disable cookies?") and through this extended information; moreover, the links to the privacy policies of third parties are indicated below, also for the purpose of disabling them (where directly available through them).

How to disable them? It is possible to disable cookies both through the browser settings (par. "How to disable cookies?") and through the mechanisms made available by some third parties (par. "Cookies used on the site").

General types of cookies used on the site

Technical cookies (first part): they are essential for the correct functioning and display of the site and to memorize the user's consent to the use of cookies.

Analytical cookies (third party): they are used for the purpose of aggregate analysis of visits to the site, through the use of a third-party service.

Cookies used on the site

First-party cookies: only technical cookies are used for the correct functioning and display of the site and for the purpose of memorizing the user's consent to the use of cookies (duration: 12 months).

Third-party cookies: the installation of analytical cookies is managed through third-party services.

How to disable cookies?

Control via browser: Commonly used browsers (e.g. Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome, Safari) accept cookies by default, but this setting can be changed by the user at any time. This applies to both PCs and mobile devices such as tablets and smartphones: it is a generally and widely supported function.

Therefore, cookies can easily be deactivated or disabled by accessing the options or preferences of the browser used and generally only third-party cookies can be blocked; in general, these options will have effect only for that browser and on that device, unless options are active to unify preferences on different devices. Specific instructions can be found on your browser's options or help page. However, disabling technical cookies can affect the full and/or correct functioning of various sites, including this site.

As a rule, the browsers in use today:

- offer the "Do not track" option, which is supported by some websites (but not all). In this way, some websites may no longer collect certain navigation data;
- offer the option of anonymous or incognito browsing: in this way no data will be collected in the browser and the browsing history will not be saved, but the browsing data will still be acquired by the manager of the website visited;
- allow you to delete stored cookies in whole or in part, but on a new visit to a website they are usually installed if this possibility is not blocked.
